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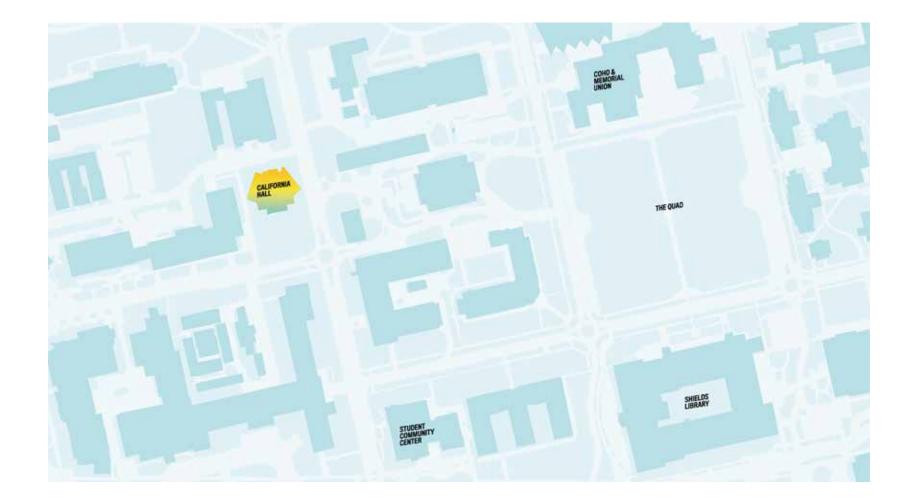


INTRODUCTION

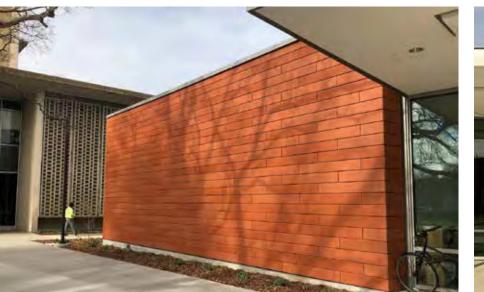

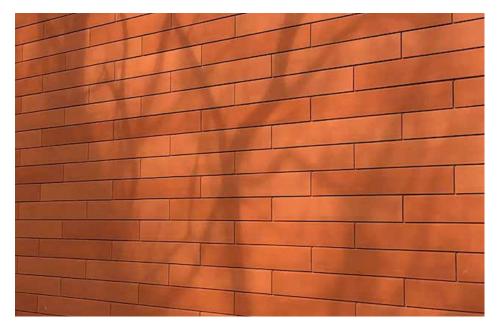

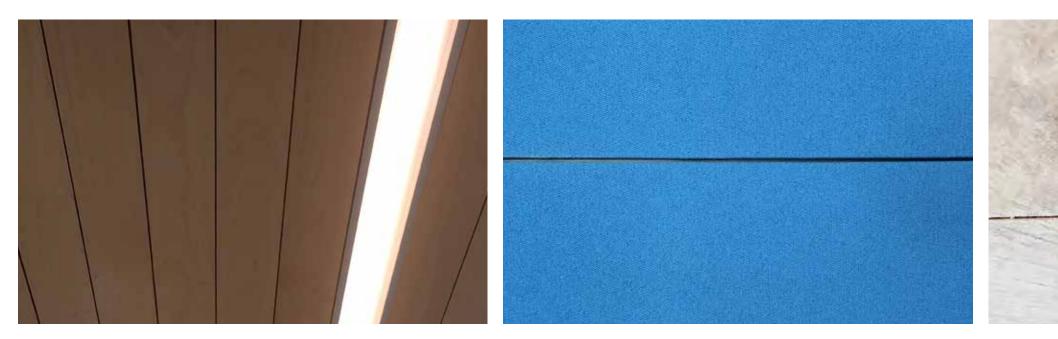

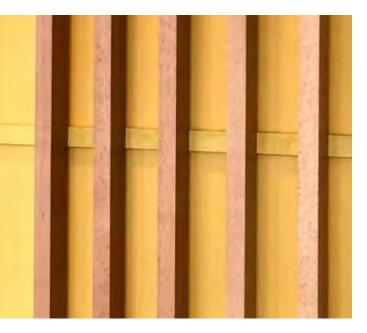

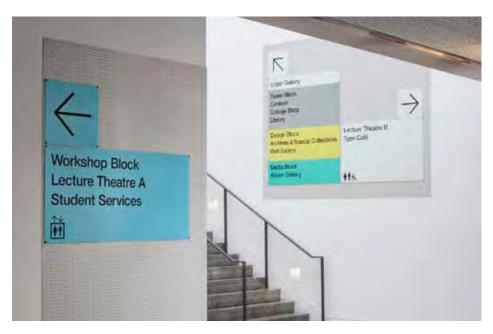

VISUAL IDENTITY GRAPHICS PALETTE

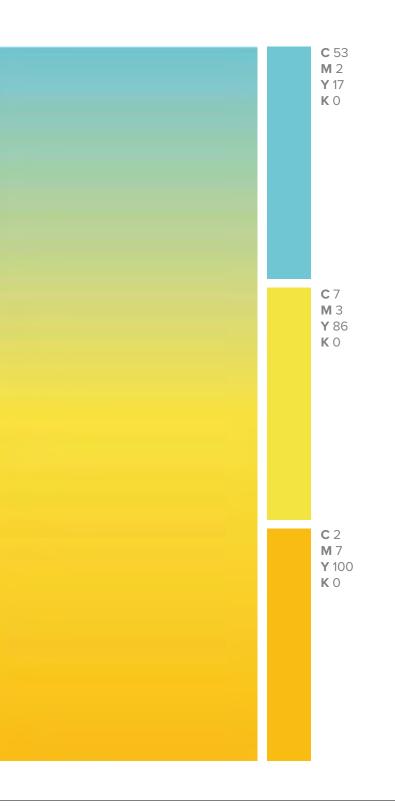

COLOR

A gradient fading from a sky blue to a golden orange contain the main colors used throughout this project. The soft, almost pastel colors are inspired by the blue Pacific Ocean and warm, yellow sunshine. The gradient is reminiscent of a sunrise, symbolic of an era of innovation thinking. In California, the future is today.

For years, California has been a hub for innovation from Silicon Valley to agricultural research. The fading colors further symbolize the diversity of thinking and interdisciplinary work. By choosing non-traditional University of California blue and yellow tones, the gradient looks towards the future while honoring the past.

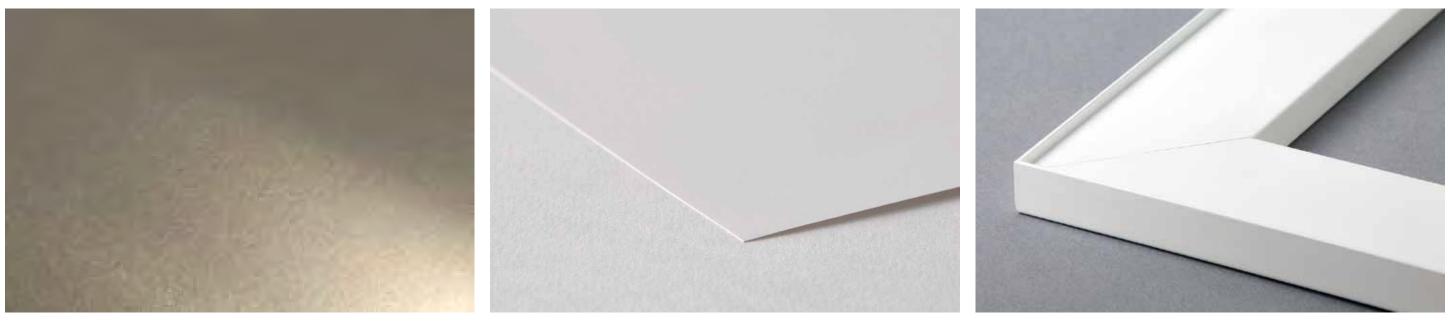

SIGNAGE SITE LOCATION PLAN

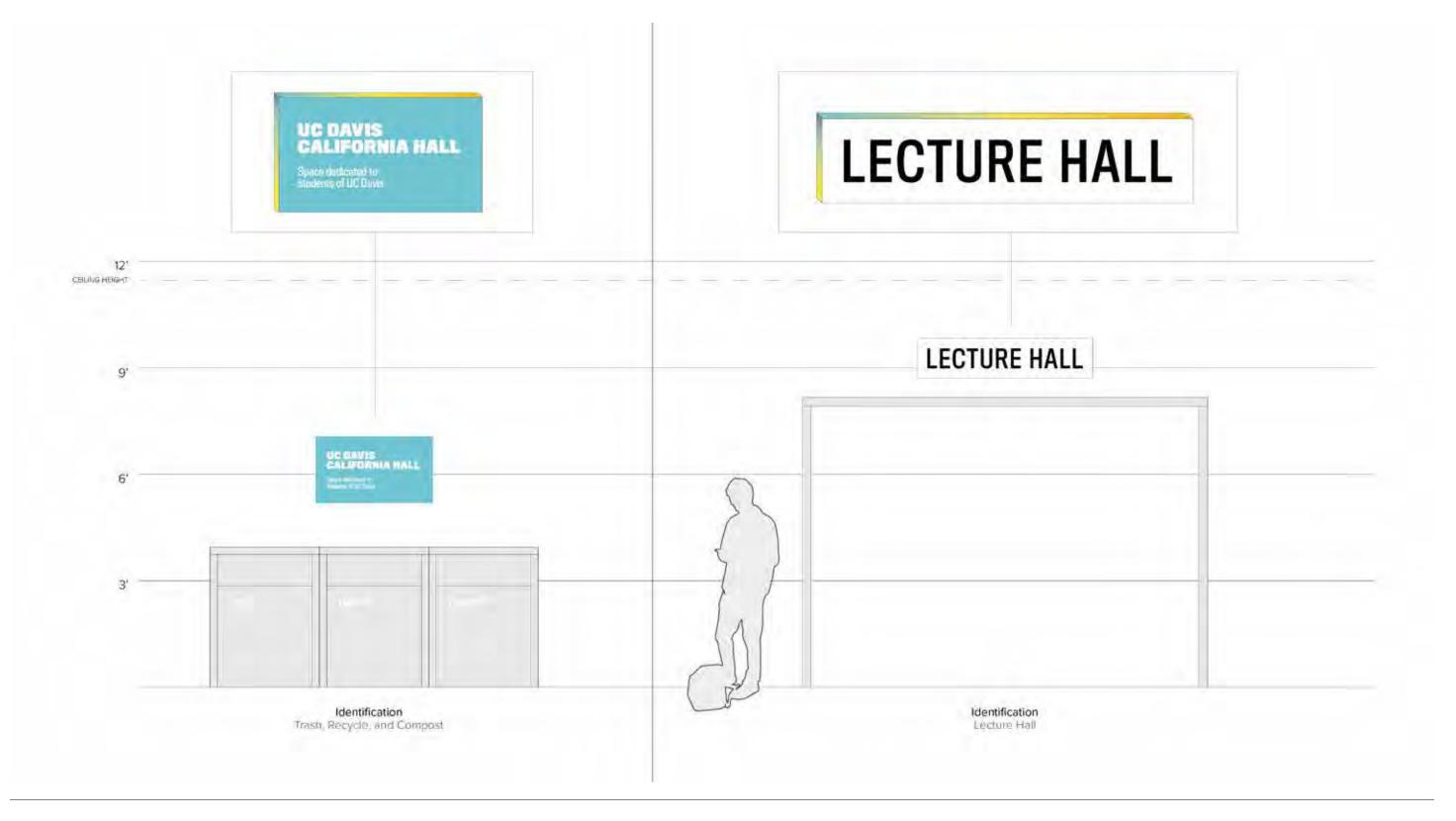
The Site Location Plan maps out the existing signage in the building along with the new sign system.



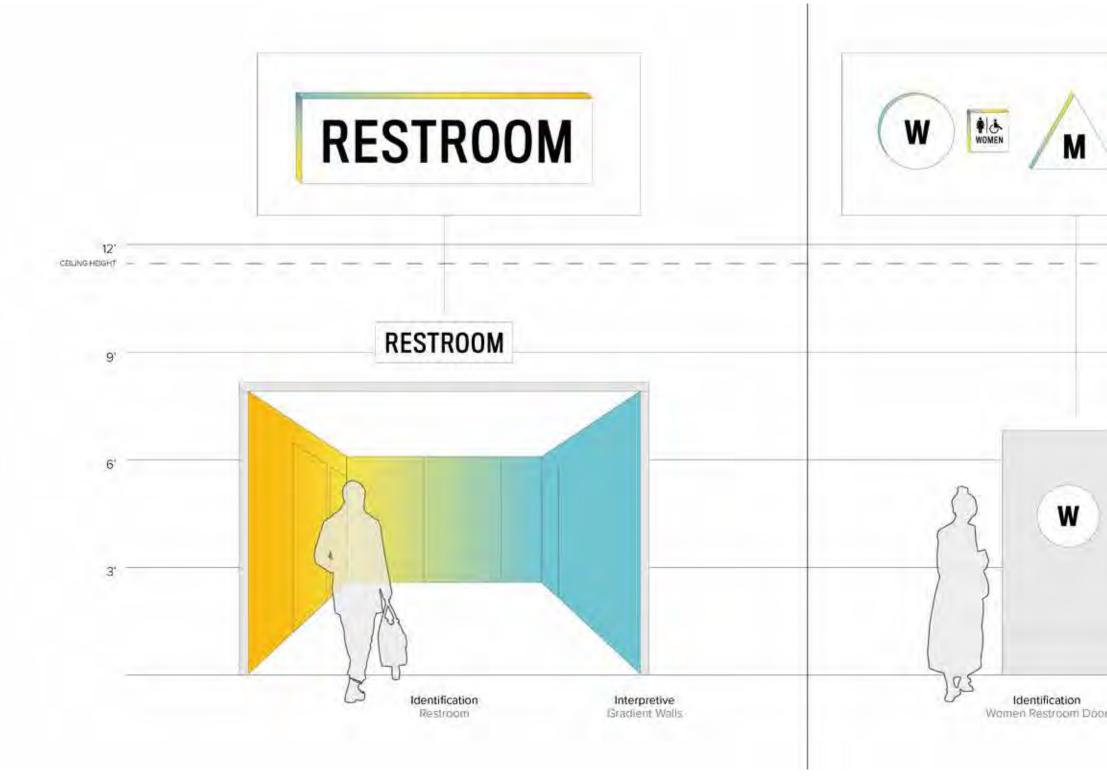


SIGNAGE PRELIMINARY DESIGN SKETCHES

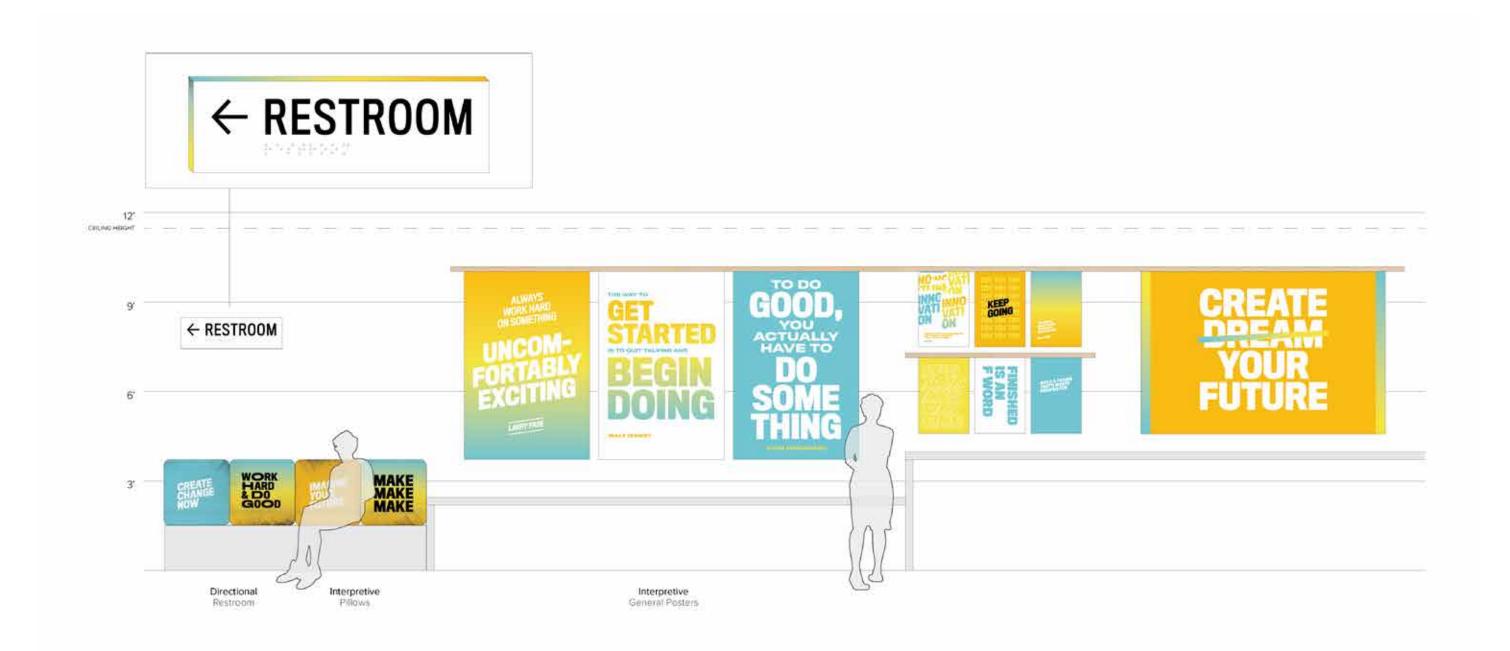
In the sketches, different sign types were explored. Many early concepts worked through the idea of modular elements to reflect constantly evolving innovation.



The Vocabulary of Sign Types is an overview of the signage system as a whole.



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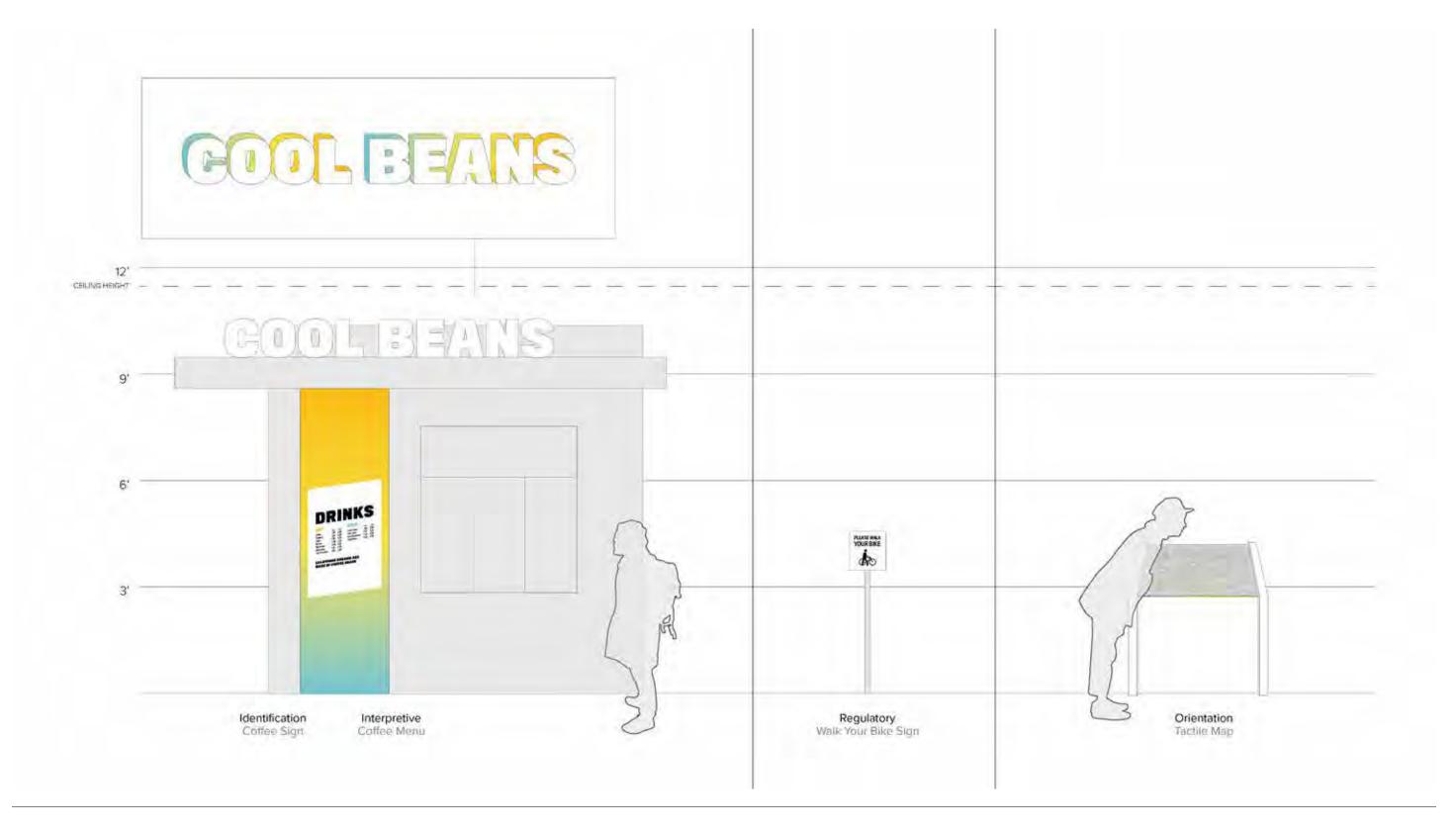


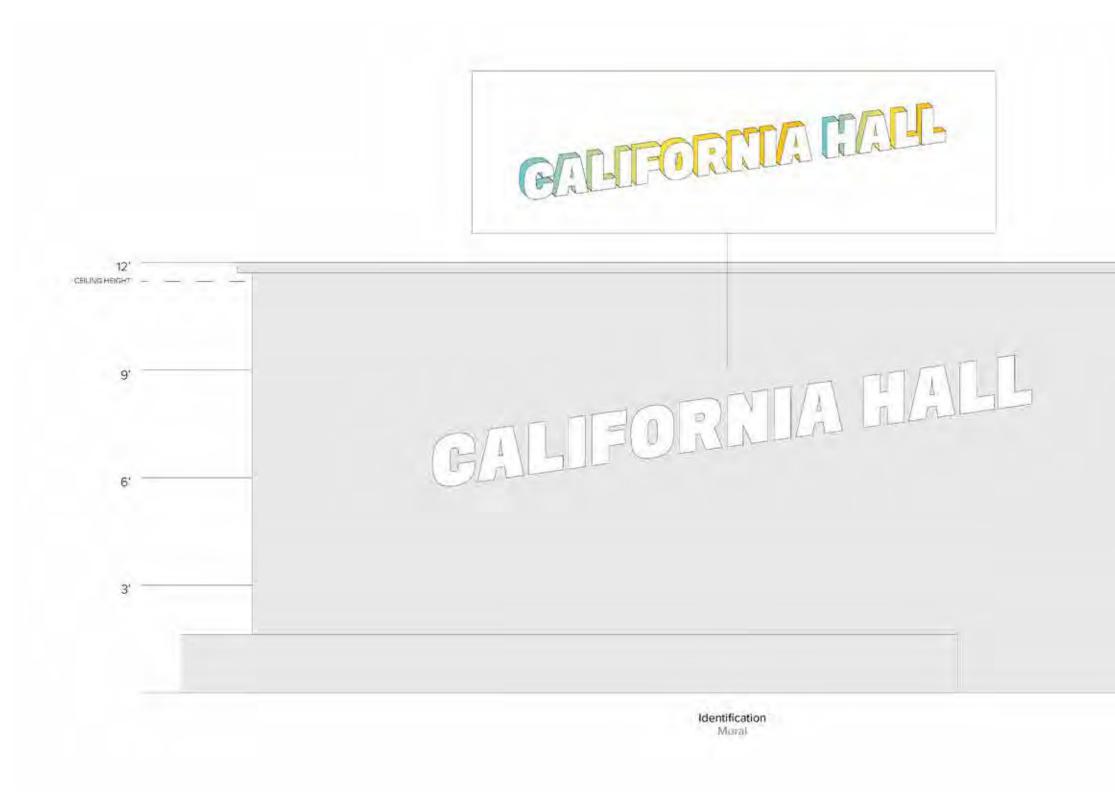

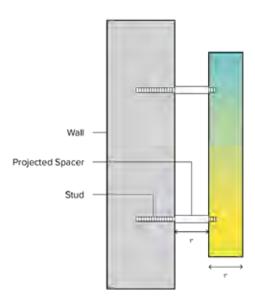

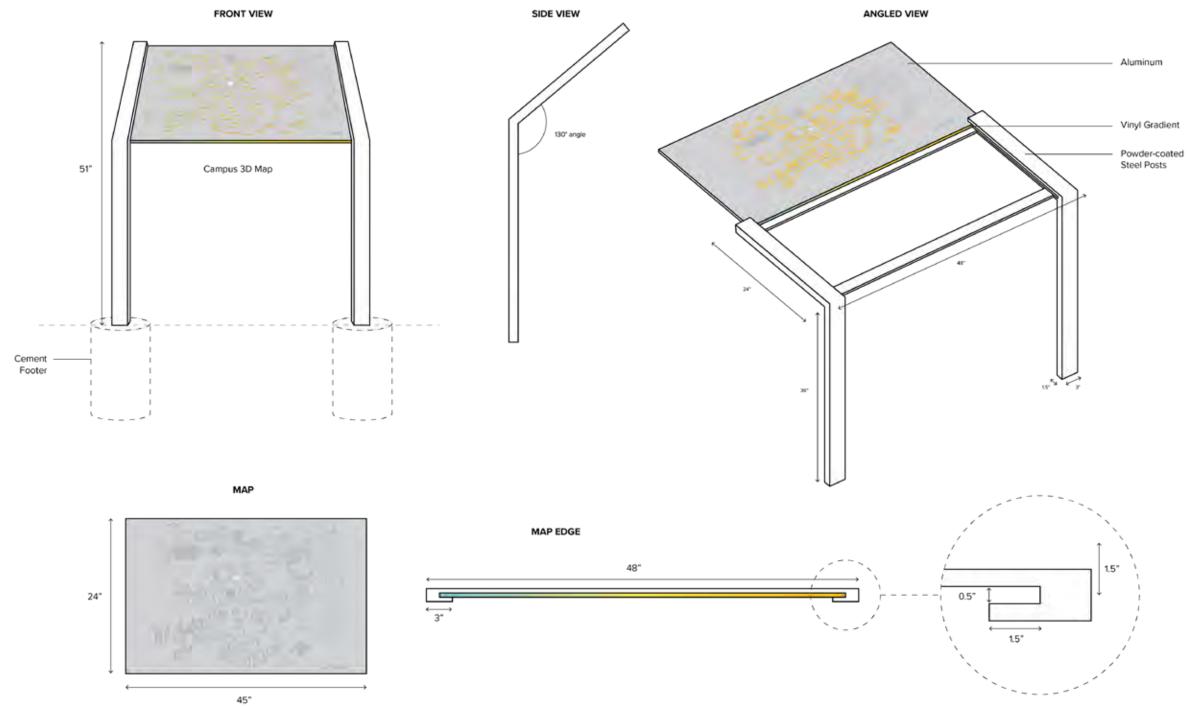

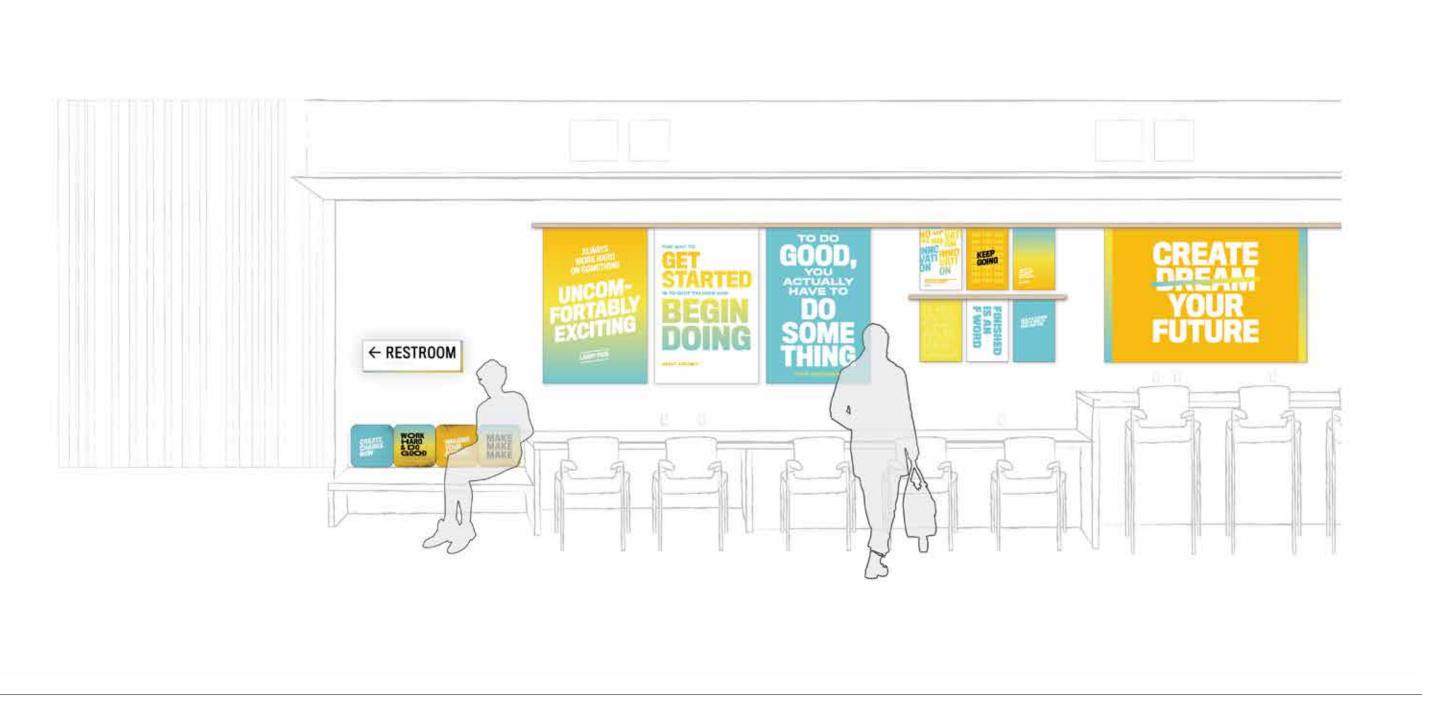

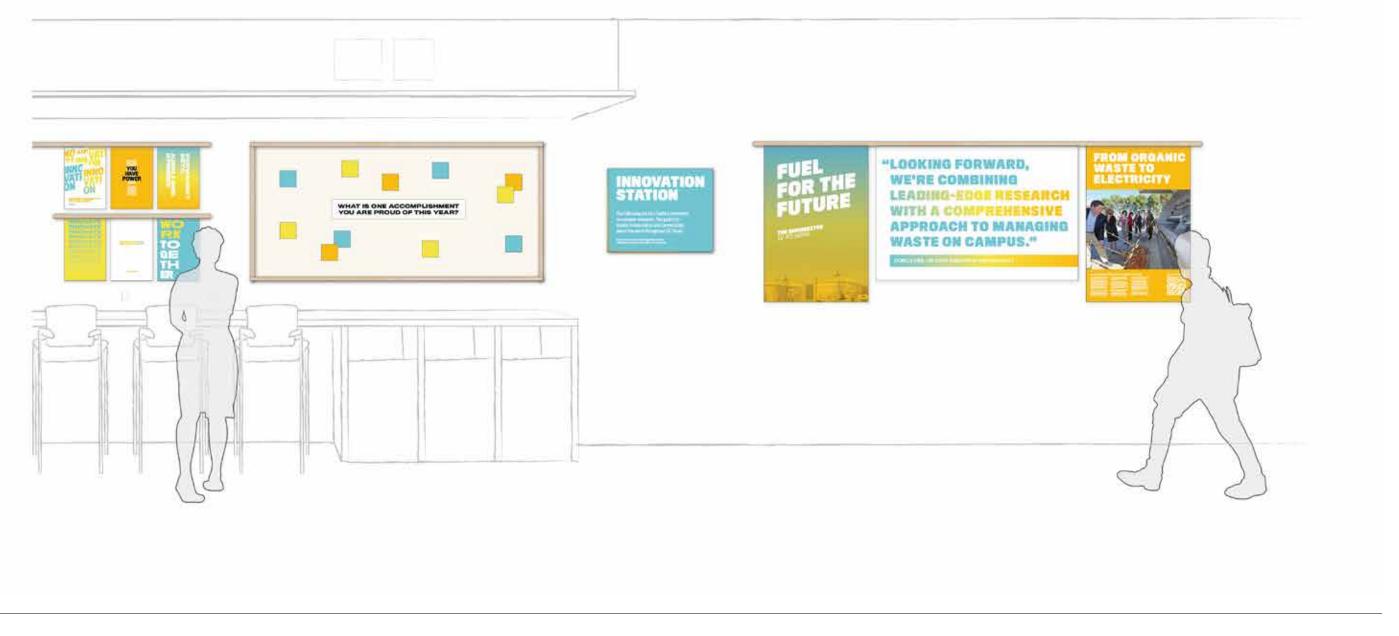

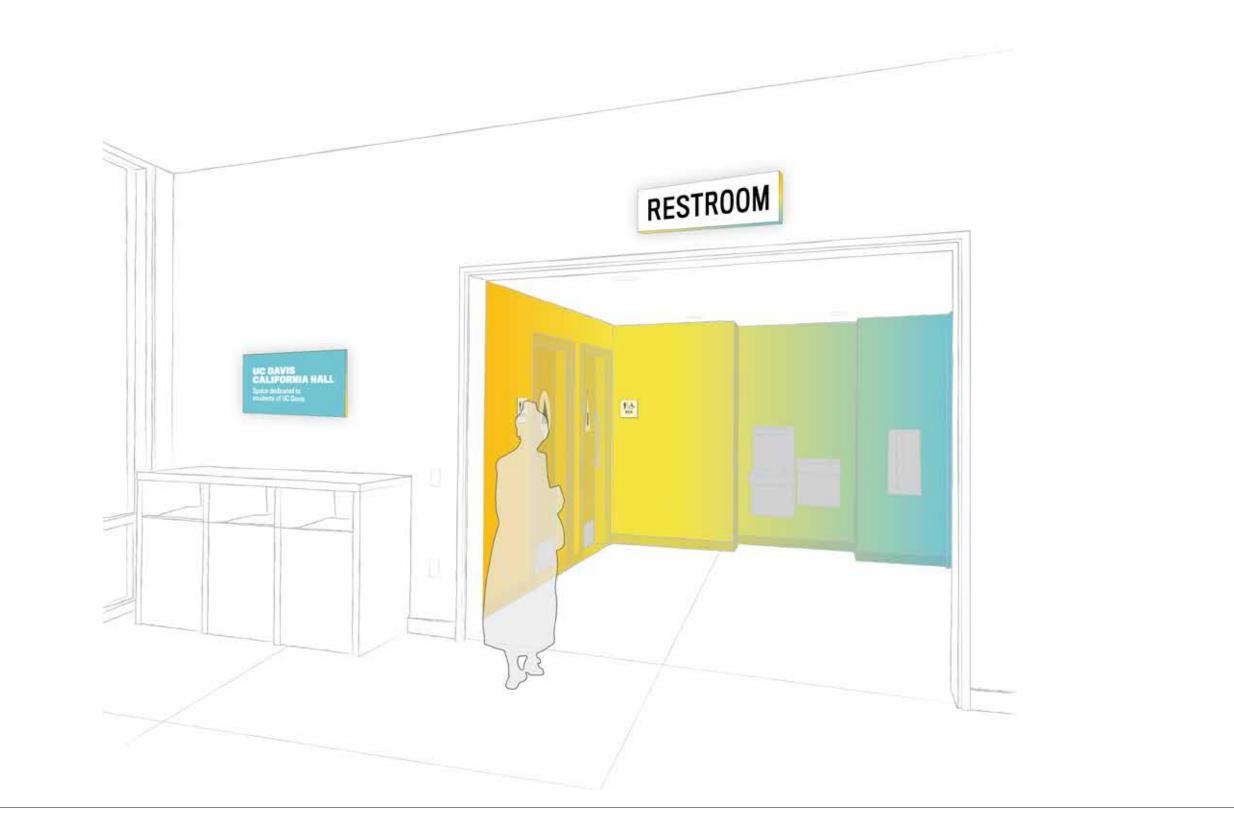
