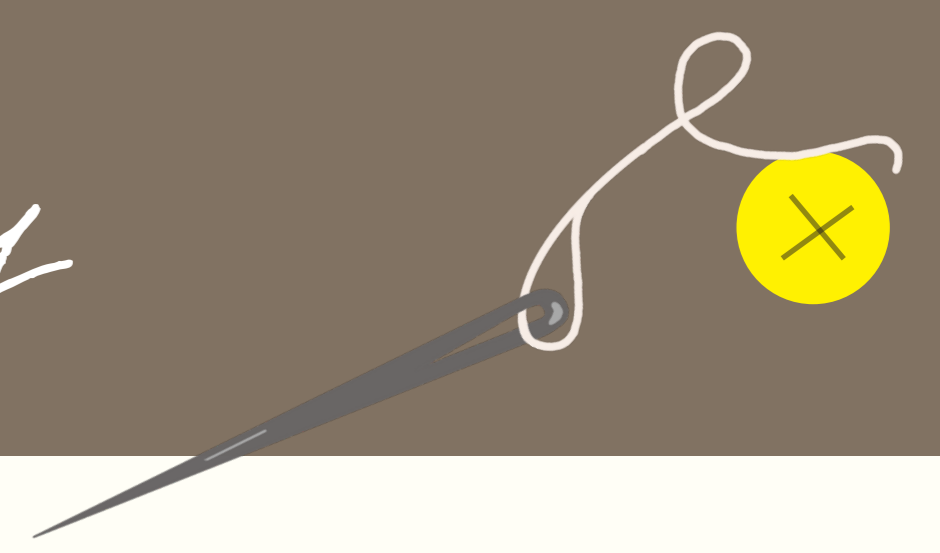


# Weaving through Jane's Story

### Jane Blyth (1739-1794)

Occupation: apprentice to Thomas Ellis, a tailor under Master Jacob Layland

Jane Blyth was born on January 31, 1738 to John Blyth at St. Mary's Castlegate Church in York. When she was 17 years old Jane became an apprentice to Thomas Ellis on May 5, 1755. On April 8, 1765, she married Christopher Todd at St. Mary's Castlegate Church. Jane died in 1794 and was buried at St. Maurice in York.

Jane was ambitious, inquisitive, hard working and had a zest for life.

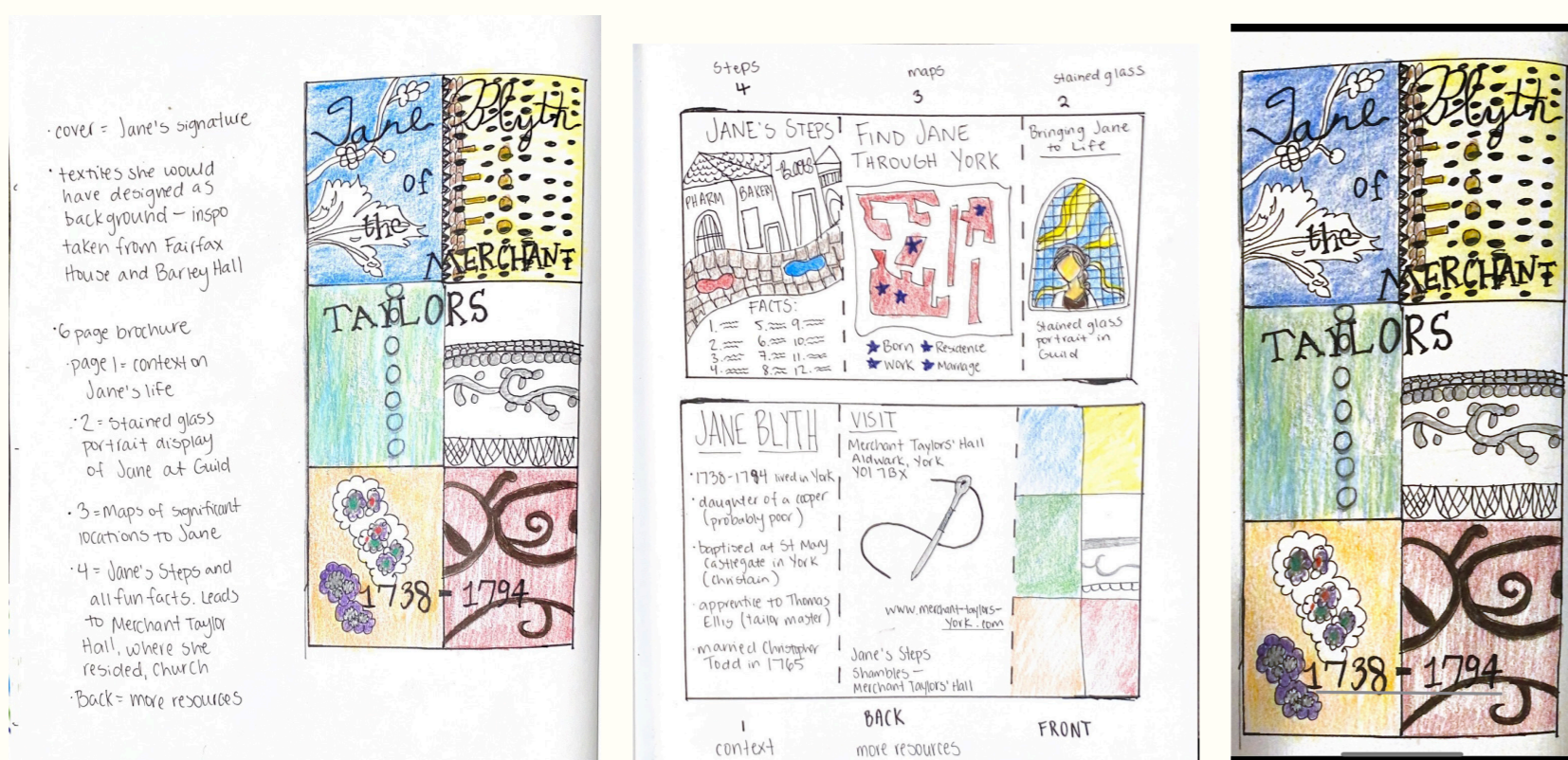
