PROJECT BRIEF

Use the historical research provided by the Merchant Taylors' Hall for the life stories of Frances Beckwith.

- Create a QR code that is displayed on interpretive signs in the Merchant Taylor's Hall that links to a digital platform with more in-depth information.
- Work in teams to develop the content, design, and digital prototype.
- Summarize the working process and research, study the feasibility (budget), and produce a working mock-up/prototype to demonstrate proof of concept hosted on a free platform (like Google slides).


The digital platform will consist of an introductory screen about the Merchant Taylors' Hall with links to sections about each of the three tailors allowing for more names to be added at a later date.

The three interactive sections should contain:

- 1. Image of the tailor
- 2. Map of where they worked in York
- 3. Brief overview of their life posed in an accessible way perhaps as a series of facts or questions
- 4. One key message that engages children

The interpretive signs in the building should contain:

- 1. Title/name
- 2. QR code link
- 3. Image of the tailor
- 4. Text that prompts people to scan the QR code

One of the mantua makers (a tailor that makes extravagant ladies dresses) of the Merchant Taylors in York.


She was a member of the Merchant Taylors Guild and took on 3 known apprentices

"a 600 year old building, comprised of the magnificent Great Hall, Almshouse, gardens, and grounds. The Company of Merchant Taylors is one of seven guilds in York whose origin dates to the 13th Century, and one of only three that have existed without a break since medieval times. a working body of master tailors, drapers, hosiers, and York freemen. The Merchant Taylors operate today as a charity organization and the Hall still serves as public meeting place, historical site, education, and event venue."

WEBSITE ANALYSIS

Brief Chronology

- 1273 Taylors are first mentioned in the Freemen's rolls when they are described as Taylours and licensed to export wool
- 1370 The Guild controlled its own admission and was administered rigorously by a Master and four Searchers
- 1380 Tailors used Petre Hall (Pear Tree Hall/Peter Hall) for their communal business activities
- 1415 First specific reference to the "the land and hall of the fraternity of St John the Baptist" (the earliest fabric of the present Great Hall dates from about this period)
- 1446 First mention of an adjoining York Taylor's maisondieu or almshouse
- 1453 Henry VI's charter incorporates a perpetual fraternity or guild of the Nativity of St John the Baptist, with a Master and four Wardens
- 1446-1503 The Small Hall first built in timber framing
- 1539 Last record of the Guilds of St John the Baptist, dissolved at the Reformation
- 1551 Merged with Drapers and Hosiers
- 1575 Great Hall fireplace constructed
- By 1589 Tenements existed adjoining a Gatehouse on Aldwark
- 1662 Royal Charter of Charles II
- 1694 Waits' (Musicians) Gallery added to Great Hall
- 1702 Henry Gyles paints Queen Anne Window in the Small Hall
- 1703 Medieval maisondieu demolished

The guild has a rich history which it aims to convey to its visitors
