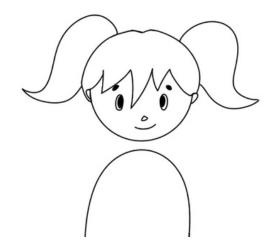
Written Proposal

- Drag queens and kings performing on aerial silks
- Aims to de-stigmatize bringing children
- Focus on uniting the local queer community
- Targeted towards families, with kid-friendly activities (after-show photo booths and face painting booths)
- Local fashion designers, design students, and children work on outfits for the drag queens/kings to perform in
- Marketing through flyers up in restaurant sponsorships, exhibition display in Whitworth Gallery, and performing drag queens' advertisement in their other participating shows.
- Amplification of queer voices by having a designated time for new/upcoming drag queens to perform

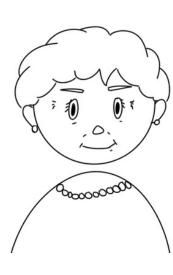
Audience Personas

Four personas who will visit Sackville Gardens.



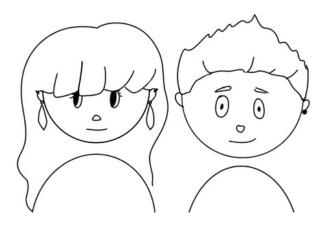
Mary the Carefree Child

- She is very excited for her parents/family to see her class' work in the show.



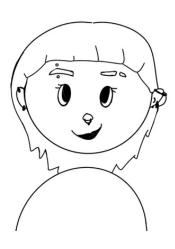
Gertrude the Supportive Grandma

- They are new to drag and maybe a little bit skeptical but came because it was family centered and seemed like a good outing for their kids.

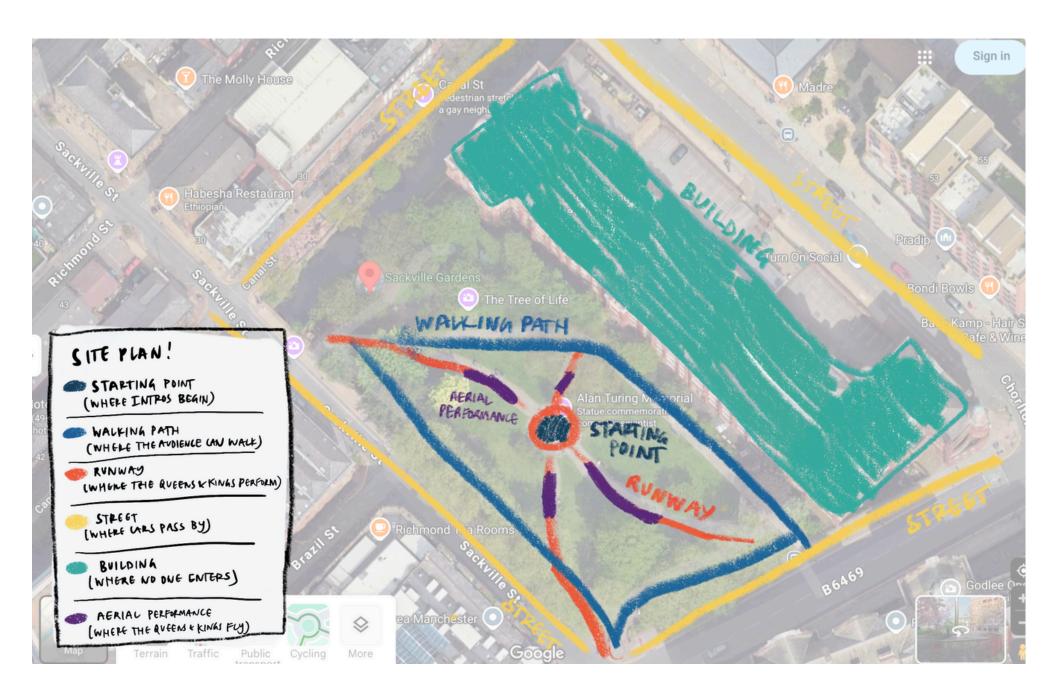


Kit the Local Queer

Drag Show Sequence

- Drag queens enter through the runways going towards the rotating center stage
- Stage acts as starting point, drag queens and the outfit designers are announced.
- Music plays and the drag queens disperse from the stage towards the silks where they perform
- After their performance, drag queens are back on center stage for applause before dispersing for intermission/outfit changes

Marketing Analysis

- "Drag March" through the streets of Manchester
- Advertising through flyers within local restaurants
- Through word-of-mouth advertising by the featured drag performers during their prior shows
- Advertising through flyers within local restaurants

In collaboration with the University of Manchester:

- Featured exhibition display in Whitworth Gallery
 - An exhibit at the Whitworth Gallery in collaboration with the featured performing drag queens which will feature some of the handmade outfits they have created to be worn on stage. This exhibition will amplify drag shows as a form of art through craftsmanship and performance.
- In collaboration with the Fashion Design Department of the University of Manchester
 - Students at the University of Manchester interested in fashion design will have the
 opportunity to showcase some of their work. The featured drag queens will be
 wearing outfits made by the student fashion designers, and the designers will be
 given credit for their designs during the runway show. This event could also
 potentially involve hosting internships to university students to assist in designing
 and organizing the event and wardrobe.
- These collaborations with the University of Manchester will tie into the overarching theme of amplifying Manchester's fashion scene.

Content Analysis

Research on the history of drag in Manchester, as well as research on the current drag scene, indicates a deeply rich history of drag shows in Manchester. The perfect example is manchester's drag ball. The first drag ball was in 1880 when 38 men were arrested by the victorian police for attending a ball cross dressed. While tragic at the time iit paved the way for manchesters budding drag presence and has now been recreated by manchesters drag queens 144 years later.

Call to Action

A family-centered community unifying display of the true art that drag is.

Appendix

Written Proposal

- Drag to Impress is an annual drag show that will annually take place during Manchester's Drag Weekend (August 22-25). The show will consist of drag gueens and kings preforming on aerial silks in Sackville Gardens.
- Drag to Impress aims to de-stigmatize bringing children to drag and attempts to unite the local queer community.
- Drag to Impress is targeted towards families, specifically with kid-friendly participatory activities such as after-show photo booths and face painting booths for children to interact with the queens and kings. Attendees can get their faces painted to match the queens and kings, take photos with them, and use photo booth props to replicate key parts of their outfits).
- Community engagement is reached through having local fashion designers, design students, and children work on outfits for the drag queens/kings to perform in. There will be three outfit changes within the show so each design set can be displayed.
- Marketing for the event will be done through flyers up in local restaurants that are sponsoring the event, an exhibition display in Whitworth Gallery of outfits drag queens and kings have made for themselves, plus the new queens and kings going around downtown with mics and speakers advertising the show. Additionally, the drag queens that are performing in the main venue will advertise the show at all their shows prior.
- The drag show is meant to be an amplification of queer voices. To do this, there will be a second show for new/upcoming drag queens and kings to perform after the aerial silk dances. This opportunity gives them a chance to display their own talents and style of drag to a large crowd and potentially gain traction in their drag careers.
